DRIVING QUESTION

How do you plan a quinceañera? What elements go into planning a successful quinceañera? Why do Hispanic Countries have and value the quinceañera?



PROJECT SUMMARY

Students will work in small groups to plan a quinceañera. They will learn about this tradition, when, where, why, and how it is celebrated. Students will vote on the best planned quince at the end of the unit.



REAL-WORLD CONTEXT

A quinceañera is a popular coming of age celebration for young people in many Spanish speaking countries. Students will be required to research and plan various aspects of a quinceañera celebration. They will have to keep in mind the budget provided and the likes/dislikes of the person they are planning the party for. This will have an impact because students at our school have quinceañeras or attend them. Through this project students will compare how they celebrate milestone birthdays to how people in other countries celebrate.



PRODUCTS & AUDIENCE

Students will create presentations to share their planned quince components. I'd like them to share with other classes and time it to be around when the quinceañera parade is for Hispanic Heritage Month.
