BIMAS - WCPSS uses a Behavior Universal Screener to help identify students who are at risk of future academic, behavioral, or emotional difficulties. Just like some students benefit from additional academic supports and interventions, we know some students would benefit from additional support to strengthen their behavioral, social, and emotional skills. The data generated from this screener will also help us determine district and school-wide programs, interventions, and training needs for staff.

The research-based screening tool our district uses is *Behavior Intervention Monitoring Assessment System-2, or BIMAS-2* (pronounced BYE-mahs two). Students' homeroom teachers complete a 1-page questionnaire about students' actions and emotions they displayed in class during a one-week time period. Teachers will complete the questionnaire twice a school year, typically around the beginning of the second and fourth quarters.

Participation in the behavior universal screener is voluntary and parents are given at least one week notification to opt their student out of the universal screening. Please see this letter about the BIMAS Screening that will be implemented the week of November 4-8, 2024. This letter also includes an opt-out form for parents.

Hurricane Helene Support - As a global studies school, we are capitalizing on the opportunity to learn about the powerful lasting impacts of natural disasters, how communities support immediate relief efforts, and what sustained support looks like in

the months following a natural disaster. From October 7th - October 18th, our school will collect the following items to donate via the Food Bank of Central and Eastern North Carolina to aid in supporting communities in Western North Carolina. Student Absences - Coming to school every day, ready to learn, is important for student success - and it's required by state law for children between the ages of 7 and 16. Excused absences include: illness or injury, a death in the family, health care appointments, court appearances, religious observance, natural disasters, etc.

When a student returns to school after an absence, the student must bring a **dated** note with the student's name, date of absence, reason for absence and signed by the parent. Parents need to provide a note within **two days** of the student's return to school or the absence(s) will be recorded as unexcused. Students are expected to make up all missed work. When requesting an excused absence for an educational reason, please complete and submit this form, in advance, for review: Request for Excused Absence for Educational Reasons form
