# Career & College Promise (CCP)

- It's a state mandated program.
- Opportunity to earn college credit while still in high school.
- Allows our students to be dually enrolled at AFHS and at Wake Tech.
- Eligible students can enroll in tuition free colleges classes at Wake Tech while still in high school.
  - Students are still responsible for the cost of any books or materials associated with their courses.

## What CCP is Not

It is **not** Apex Friendship High School at Wake Tech.

It is Wake Tech at Wake Tech.

Students are enrolled in 2 totally separate educational entities at the same time.

2 separate school's

- Policies and Procedures
- Student email accounts
- School Calendars

And, neither school has access to the other school's student information.

# Why CCP?

- Introduction to the college experience and expectations
- Receiving both high school and college credit
- Assistance with admissions into future college of choice
- Provides a jumpstart to career plans, job training, skills and certifications.

#### 9th & 10th Graders

# **Career & Technical Education Pathway**

- Recommendation of the principal or designee, along with memo of rationale for recommendation.
- Demonstrates college readiness in English, reading, and mathematics (chart is on WTCC website)

# **College Transfer Pathway**

- Identified AIG in English/reading and Math.
- Demonstrate college readiness (chart on WTCC website)
- Recommendation of principal
- Written consent of parents
- Receive mandatory academic advising prior to course registration.

#### 11th & 12th Graders

# **Career & Technical Education Pathway**

- Unweighted GPA of 2.8 or higher,
   OR
- Demonstrates college readiness in English, reading, and mathematics (chart is on WTCC website),
   OR
- Recommendation of principal

# College Transfer Pathway

• Unweighted GPA of 2.8 or higher,

#### OR

 Demonstrates college readiness in English, reading, and mathematics on an assessment (chart on WTCC website)

#### **PATHWAYS**

#### College Transfer

- Begin earning college credit toward Wake Tech's University Transfer degree programs which are intended for eventual transfers to a four year college or university.
  - Examples of Classes to Take: Art/Music/ Theatre Appreciation, Introduction to Interpersonal Communication, General Psychology, Introduction to Sociology, Principles of Micro/Macroeconomics, Quantitative Literacy, General Biology/Chemistry, etc.

#### **Career & Technical Education**

- Leads to certificate or diploma. It is designed for students who want to work toward the completion of a credential before graduating from high school.
- Pathways may include:
  - Biotechnologies, Engineering
     Technologies & Skilled Trades,
     Business & Professional Services,
     Health Sciences, Information
     Technology, Public Safety or
     Transportation Technologies

### AFHS Specific Parameters for CCP

#### Class Schedule

- Juniors & Seniors must be enrolled in a minimum of two AFHS classes
- o 11th Graders must have a total of 4 classes (2 AFHS- 2 CCP or 3 AFHS- 1 CCP or 4 AFHS and CCP on your own time).
- If leaving AFHS after 2nd period, choose Wake Tech classes beginning at 11:30 or later
- If leaving AFHS after 3rd period, choose Wake Tech classes beginning at 1:30 or later


#### No Guaranteed Parking

- 11th grade students participating in CCP who have a modified schedule are not guaranteed a parking space
- Students are not permitted to be on AFHS campus during periods for which they are not scheduled for an AFHS course
  - Students may not stay on campus for any periods they have off (even if CCP course is online)
  - Students must have reliable consistent transportation to or from campus

## AFHS Specific Parameters for CCP cont.

- Students cannot receive high school credit for World Language through CCP
- Students cannot take in person CCP Courses that conflict with their AFHS classes.
  - AFHS courses take priority over CCP courses
- Students must take both <u>HIS 131 American History I and HIS 132</u>
   <u>American History II</u> for their High School American History credit.
  - You are only able to do this by taking the Associates of Arts Pathway
- Wake Tech semester's do not align with our semesters, so students should plan accordingly.
  - WT semesters begin and end before ours do, and there is overlap moving from the fall to spring semester in terms of our fall courses ending and Wake Tech's spring course beginning.





## Frequently Asked Questions

#### AP or CCP?

- \_\_\_\_ It depends on you and the class, but here is some information to consider:
  - AP Classes are taught at the college level with high school support
  - You will earn college credit by passing a CCP class.
  - You will earn college credit by scoring at least a 3 on the AP exam, not by passing the AP class.

# Can CCP Class count as a high school graduation requirement?

- Some classes can count as a fourth social studies or fourth math.
- Two American History classes (HIS 131 and HIS 132)
- English and science will require more than one Wake Tech class, see here for specification

#### How do CCP Classes count in your GPA?

- CCP Classes in the College Transfer Pathway have the same weight as an AP class (one extra quality point)
- CCP classes in the CTE Pathway only have the same weight if listed on the <u>Comprehensive</u> <u>Articulation Agreement</u>, otherwise, the class weight is the same as an academic class
- CCP classes must be at least 3 credit hours to count as a high school credit

#### Can I take Wake Tech CCP classes online?

- How and when a class is offered is not known until the registration period opens for Wake Tech.
- View the <u>Wake Tech Course Catalog</u> to see how the class was previous offered.
- Many classes are offered online
  - This means asynchronous and requires a student to be an independent learner.

- **November 4:** Self-registration for courses begins at 7 a.m.

- November 28-29: College closed
- **December 1:** Self-registration deadline at 11:59 p.m.
- **December 1:** Waitlist drop deadline
- **December 23 January 1:** College closed
- January 2: Course Request form opens at 9 a.m.
- January 8: First day of class for the 16-week and first eight-week sessions
- January 10: 12 p.m. course Request deadline (last day to request courses for all sessions, as registration cycle ends)
- **January 13:** 4 p.m. deadline to drop a class without a "W" grade for the first eight-week session
- January 17: 4 p.m. deadline to to drop a class without a "W" grade for the 16-week session

- January 20: College closed
- February 6: First day of class for the 12-week session
- **February 11:** Last day to drop class with a "W" grade for the first eight-week session
- February 13: Last day to drop class without a "W" grade for the 12-week session
- March 5: Last day of class for the first eight-week session
- March 6: First day of class for the second eight-week session
- March 11: 4 p.m. deadline to drop a class without a "W" grade for the second eight-week session
- March 24: Last day to drop a class with a "W" grade for the
   16-week session
- April 3: Last day to drop a class with a "W" grade for the 12-week session
- April 15: Last day to drop with a "W" grade for the second eight-week session
- May 9: Last day of class for the 16-week, 12-week and second eight-week sessions
