Promotion Requirements

Promotion to Grade 12:

Minimum of 18 credits: Three credits must be English I, English II and English III, and enrollment in remaining courses required to graduate.

English	4	English I, II, III, and IV
Mathematics	4	Math 1; Math 2; Math 3; and fourth math course based on student's post-high school plans
Science	3	Earth Science or AP Environmental Science; Biology; and either Physical Science, Chemistry, or Physics
Social Studies	4	World History; Civic Literacy or AP Government; American History or APUSH; Economics & Personal Finance
Health & PE	1	Healthful Living
Required Electives	2	2 electives of any combination from either CTE, Arts Education or World Language
Additional Electives	4	Courses from any subject area *To create opportunities for after graduation, we encourage students to take 4 additional electives beyond the requirement in an area of concentration (CTE, Arts, or any other subject area)
Total	22	MINIMUM required to graduate

To earn Latin Honors at Graduation:

- O Summa Cum Laude: 4.25 weighted GPA or higher
- O Magna Cum Laude: 4.00 to 4.249 weighted GPA
- O Cum Laude: 3.75 to 3.99 weighted GPA

Mid-Year Graduation

- Must meet with your counselor to discuss graduation requirements and post-grad plans.
- Must be approved by Mr. Pittman.
 - Priority Deadline: Friday, March 28th, 2025.

Grade Point Average (GPA): Your GPA is the sum of all the quality points earned divided by the total number of attempted credits.

** Mainly college transfer courses

College Eligibility: The Minimum Course Requirements (MCR) for the University of North Carolina System of Higher Education determine your eligibility to apply. Completing these courses means you have satisfied the minimum requirements needed to be *eligible to apply* to a public university in North Carolina. The requirements are:

- D A minimum weighted GPA of 2.5. Students with a weighted HS GPA greater than or equal to 2.5 and less than 2.8 are required to submit a standardized test score of a 17 or higher ACT or 930 or higher SAT
- D 4 credits of English
- D 4 credits of Math (Math 1, 2, 3 and one credit beyond Math 3)
- $\hbox{\bf D} \quad \hbox{\bf 2 credits of Social Studies (Including 1 in U.S. History)} \\$
- D 3 credits of Science [Earth Science; Biology; Physical Science (Physical Science, Chemistry, or Physics)]
- 2 additional academic courses from English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language, or Computer Science (in alignment with career objectives)
- D Optional: 2 consecutive credits of the same foreign language (This is still a requirement for many out of state universities)

****It is also strongly recommended by colleges that you take a math course during your senior year of high school. Students are also encouraged to take more than just two years of a foreign language when considering more competitive colleges/universities.

Early Decision	Early Action
Binding: must withdraw all other applications if admitted to attend that school	Non-binding: must commit or decline typically by May 1
Can apply only for Early Action and Regular Deadline at other schools	No restrictions on applying to other schools for Early Action and Regular Deadline
Due usually between Oct 15 -Nov 1; notified by Dec 1-Jan 1	Due usually between Oct 15 - Nov 1; notified by Dec 1-Jan 30
Early Decision II is offered by some schools; similar rules but later application	A great way to take the pressure off! Beneficial for financial aid candidates!
