

## **Acceptable Tests for AIG Eligibility in Wake County Public School System**

The list below includes frequently used tests. Additional standardized tests that provide national norms and fixed items may be acceptable. As tests are updated and re-normed, the most current versions and norms should be used. Results based on versions and/or norms older than one year at the time of testing will not be accepted. Age norms should be used for aptitude, intelligence, and achievement tests designed to be administered in a one-on-one setting (e.g., WISC-V, WJIV).

The standardized instruments must be administered and scored in a school or private setting by an educator, psychologist, or qualified person other than the student's guardian or caregiver. Information regarding qualifications is available from the test publishers. Please contact the school psychologist in the AIG Department for further assistance.
