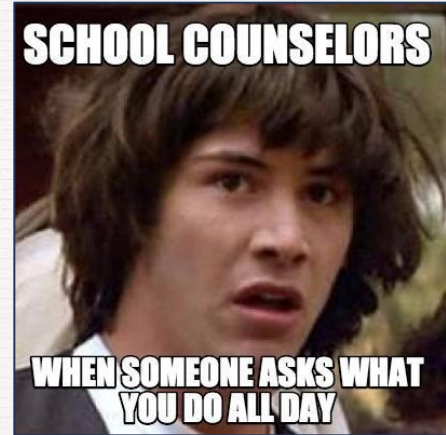

- ★ *If you have a question or need help and don't know who to ask....ask your School Counselor! If we don't know the answer, we can likely find out or get you connected to the correct person.*



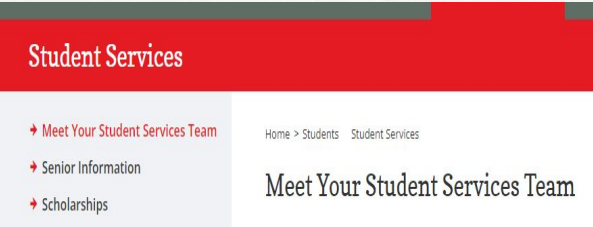

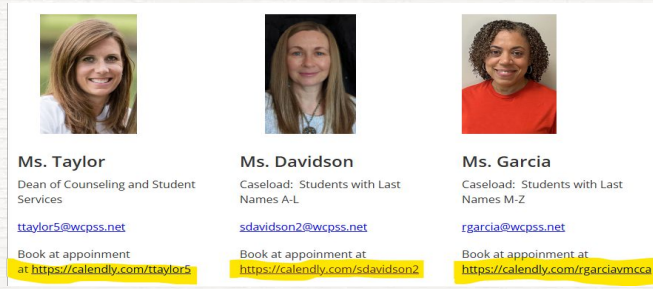

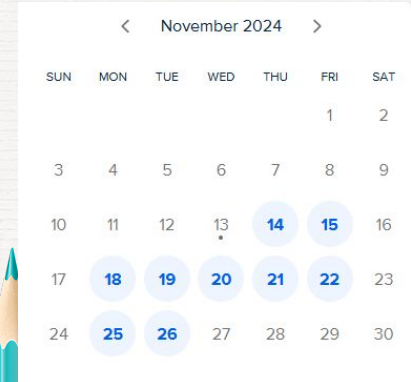
1. Visit the Student Services page of the VMCCA website.

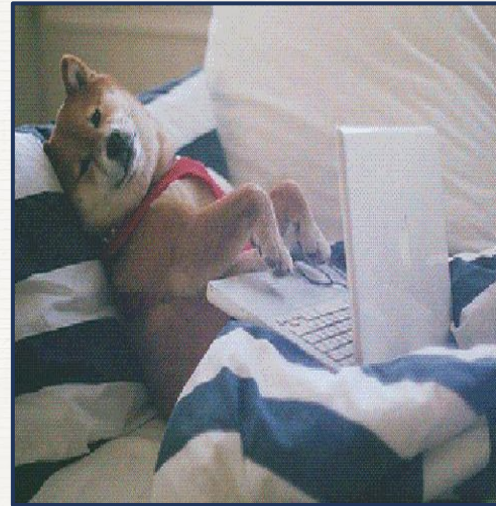
- ★ Juniors and seniors may enroll in up to 2 dual-enrollment courses per year (one each semester)
- ★ Minimum GPA 2.2 unweighted (2.8 unweighted for ENG 111)
- ★ Final grade of C or above, college transfer credit
- ★ AP-equivalent quality points toward high school GPA
