



College & Career Ready (CCR) Recognition

School Goal- 95% of graduates will be classified as CCR in at least 5 of the following:

- 2.5 weighted GPA
- Minimum SAT 930 or ACT 17
- Score 3 or higher on 3 or more EOCs
- 2 high school credits of World Language (courses taken in MS for HS credit count)
- Silver or higher on WorkKeys exam
- 3 or more college/university transfer courses with grade of C or higher
 - ◆ AP courses, BIO 110, 5th period
- 2 or more CTE credentials
 - ◆ Ex. OSHA, Microsoft Excel, Python, etc.
- 10 or fewer unexcused absences per semester of Junior & Senior years
- Community Engagement (40+ Hours)
- Internship/Clinical/Salon/Employment (120+ Hours)
- Completion of WTCC Program Area

Post-Secondary Plans

- ✖ **Career Development Coordinator - Mr. Baldwin**
 - Career exploration / internships
- ✖ **Grade 13**
 - Pursue a 5th year at VMCCA and attend WTCC tuition free
 - WTCC courses must be in your program area
 - Students who take advantage of 5th period classes, summer courses, and Grade 13, may be able to earn an associates degree in their program area
- ✖ **Community College - Wake Tech**
 - Open admission policy
 - College transfer program
- ✖ **College/University**
 - Start exploring a range of colleges - develop a list
 - Big Future and CFNC great resources for developing college list
 - **SAT/ACT – Scores required if weighted GPA between 2.5-2.8. Above 2.8, optional to report**
 - All Juniors will take ACT on March 11th- those scores can be submitted.
- ✖ **College Visits**
 - One of the best ways to see if a college is a good fit for you
 - Many colleges provide virtual tour videos, can be helpful if not able to visit in-person
- ✖ **Summer Plans**
 - Consider summer programs, volunteer opportunities, and/or work



Factors Considered in College Admissions

★ Academic Performance

- Academic rigor
- GPA/Class Rank
- Test scores (if submitted)

★ Personal Characteristics

- Essays
- Extracurricular Activities (including work)
 - Leadership, volunteering
- Recommendation Letters

How to apply to college using the Common App



Do NOT begin Common App until after August 1st.



College admission in North Carolina just got easier.

Seniors with a weighted GPA of 2.8 and above, you're already admitted to college. And juniors, you're well on your way.*



YOUR MOMENT HAS ARRIVED, AND THIS IS YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO MEET IT HEAD ON. With NC College Connect, you can be directly admitted to participating colleges and universities where you already meet admissions requirements. No essays, test scores, or recommendation letters needed. Yes, it's that easy.

Seniors—if you had a 2.8 weighted GPA at the end of your junior year and meet NC College Connect requirements, you're already in! Not a senior just yet? You could be eligible for this program next year!

NC College Connect is a program that directly admits North Carolina public high school seniors to participating UNC System universities, North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities, and their local North Carolina community college where they already meet admissions requirements.








Division I & II College Athletes

WTCC courses - Reminders

- ✖ During Senior year, you will have either 1 or 2 WTCC classes per semester.
 - WE has 1 class period per semester
 - BP, NA, FMT, SGD, and COS have 2 class periods per semester
- ✖ Students are expected to attend at least 90% of all scheduled class meetings.
 - If absences exceed 10%, instructor will submit a withdrawal form to WTCC Registration and Records.
 - If withdrawn after the 10th day of VMCCA/WCPSS classes, the grade will reflect as a WF.
 - WF = Withdraw Failing (Zero GPA quality points)
- ✖ **WTCC GPA**
 - Enrollment in your WTCC Program area marks the beginning of your college GPA and transcript.
 - If your WTCC GPA drops below a 2.0, you will **NOT** be eligible for financial aid **after high school graduation.**
- ✖ **Stay connected**
 - It is essential for students to check both WCPSS student email and WTCC email.
 - During senior year regular communication will be shared via WCPSS student email.

- ★ Juniors and seniors may enroll in up to 2 dual-enrollment courses per year (one each semester)
- ★ Minimum GPA 2.2 (2.8 for ENG 111)
- ★ Final grade of C or above, college transfer credit
- ★ AP-equivalent quality points toward high school GPA

Registration Instructions



1. Review credit check sheet.
2. Write your first and last name and your counselor's name where indicated at top of your course selection sheet form.
 - a. Davidson - Last names A - L
 - b. Garcia - Last names M - Z
3. Check your WTCC Program area.
4. Check off your remaining GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS courses (based on credit check sheet).
5. **Then**, select the number of elective courses along that correspond to your WTCC Program area. **Total of 4 or 6 WCPSS courses (core and electives)**
 - a. Two (2) credits of the same foreign language is highly encouraged for 4-year colleges/universities, but not required to graduate.
6. **Lastly**, select 2 alternate courses (elective courses) by writing "A" on the line.
7. **Discuss - Talk with your teachers about their recommendations for your course selections if you are unsure.**



Modified Schedule info



Key points

- Must have at least one WCPSS course each semester
- Must provide transportation
- Cannot be on campus or stay on campus during modified class period(s)
- Student responsibility to verify athletic eligibility
- Form required - turn in ASAP
- Not guaranteed - based on course offerings, class sizes, & grad requirements

Modified Schedule is a privilege given to SENIORS by the principal. This form must be submitted prior to the 10th day of academic classes for the semester. This form DOES NOT guarantee a modified schedule. The student and parent must agree to the following terms.			
Parent Initials	Student Initials	Modified Schedule is a privilege and can be revoked (Wake Tech Program area classes cannot be dropped).	
		Students MUST have at least two classes (1 must be a WCPSS class) per semester to be considered full time.	
		Students CANNOT be on VMCCA's campus when not scheduled for a class. Students must leave campus immediately once they have completed the last scheduled class OR arrive on campus at the start of the next class period each day. <ul style="list-style-type: none">Students who are on campus when they are not scheduled for a class will have their modified schedule revoked.	
		Students must provide their own transportation to school - either personal vehicle or carpool. Students who ride the bus (to and from school) CANNOT have a modified schedule.	
		The student and parent/guardian understand that the school is no longer liable for the student once they leave campus.	
		The student waives the right to take a full schedule and has verified with their counselor that they will be able to fulfill ALL graduation requirements with a modified schedule.	
		It is the student's responsibility to determine whether a modified schedule will affect admission to a particular college/university.	
		Student drivers: NC State law requires students under 18 to pass at least 70% of the coursework each term. Students with reduced course load who fail any course will not meet this standard.	
		All athletes must pass 3 classes each semester in order to maintain athletic eligibility.
