Enrollment in your WTCC Program area marks the beginning of your college GPA and transcript.

If your WTCC GPA drops below a 2.0, you will **NOT** be eligible for financial aid **after graduation**.

WTCC Attendance

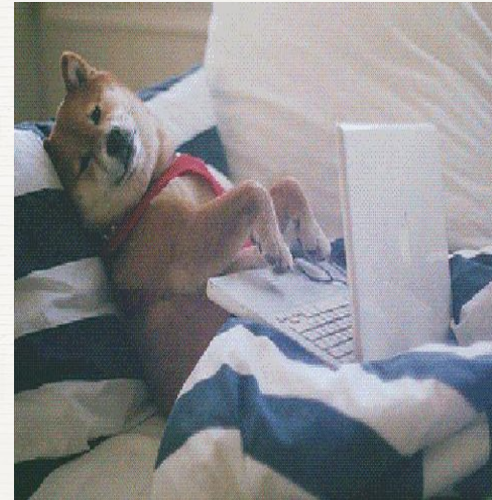
- ✗ Students are expected to attend at least 90% of all scheduled class meetings.
- ✗ If absences exceed 10%, instructor will submit a withdrawal form to WTCC Registration and Records.
- ✗ If withdrawn after the 10th day of VMCCA/WCPSS classes, the grade will reflect as a WF.
 - WF = Withdraw Failing (Zero GPA quality points)

Registration Instructions



1. Review credit check sheet.
2. Write your first name and last name, sign & date, and check your WTCC Program area on the rising JUNIOR course selection sheet. Write your School Counselor's name at the top of your course selection sheet form.
 - a. Davidson - Last names A - L
 - b. Garcia - Last names M - Z
3. Check off your JUNIOR year required courses: English, Social Studies, Math & Science.
4. Double check you have earned Healthful Living Credit. If not, check Healthful Living.
5. Consider Spanish if you have NOT already earned (or will earn) 2 credits by the end of this year.
 - a. 2 credits of the same foreign language is highly encouraged for 4-year colleges/universities.
6. Select the number of elective courses that correspond to your WTCC Program area.
 - a. For example, Biotech students will have WTCC for 2 class periods (1 class each semester), so they will need 6 WCPSS classes, for a total of 8 classes.
 - b. If you requested to change your WTCC program area, please register for your CURRENT program area.
7. Select 2 alternate courses by writing "A" on the line.
8. **Discuss - Talk with your teachers about their recommendations for your course selections.**
