ADMISSION

Open enrollment requires only your high school diploma. Your GPA or SAT/ACT scores are used to determine proper course placement, and competitive programs (Nursing, Dental Hygiene, etc.) may have additional admissions requirements.

The UNC-System hosts 16 universities that are funded by the state of North Carolina. Residents of NC are able to take advantage of in-state tuition which is significantly less than what out-of-state students pay.

Private and independent colleges sometimes have more flexible entrance requirements and vary widely. These colleges and universities are generally more expensive, however, they can sometimes offer more financial aid.



Students don't have to limit their search to colleges in NC. It is important to note that students attending out-of-state colleges and universities will be subject to out-of-state tuition fees at public universities.

UNC SYSTEM MINIMUM **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**



- 4 units of English
- 4 units of Math, 1 unit for which Math III is a prerequisite
- 4 units of History

• Effective for students starting college in fall 2025: Students with a weighted GPA between 2.5 and less than 2.8 must submit SAT or ACT scores. Students with a weighted GPA of 2.8 or higher have the option to submit these scores.

Step-by-Step Guide to Apply for RDS

- 1. Gather Necessary Information (see handout)
- 2. Visit the RDS Website (ncresidency.org) OR access through CFNC (cfnc.org)
 - If you already have a CFNC account, use those credentials to log-in DO NOT CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT
- 4. Complete Residency Determination Questions once application started, must be done within 25 days
- 5. Submit Supporting Documents, if requested 20% will be required to submit
- 6. Record Your RCN (residency certification number) this will be used for college applications
- 7. Check Your Residency Status:
 - Student will receive an email with residency determination: in-state or out-of-state resident for tuition purposes.
- 8. Appeal if Necessary:
 - If you disagree with the determination, request an appeal within 10 days the RDS system.
