What is Career & College Promise?

The Career and College Promise Program (CCP) is a **dual-enrollment** program designed to provide **eligible NC high school students** an opportunity to **earn college credit** while still in high school.

Career and College Promise is a state-mandated program administered by Wake Tech.

Benefits of Enrolling in CCP...

Opportunity to explore over 40 academic programs while being dually enrolled in high school, allowing students to receive both high school and college credit

Assists with admission into future college of choice – demonstrates college readiness and rigor

Introduces the “college experience” to students

Provides a jumpstart to career plans, job training, skills, and certifications



Benefits of Enrolling in CCP... (cont.)

Saves students and parents money on college tuition and lightens the course load for future college enrollment!

CCP Pathways

The CCP program offers two types of pathways with three variations of pathway enrollment:

Two Pathways

Career and Technical Education Pathway (CTE)
College Transfer Pathway (CT)

Three Variations of Enrollment

CTE Pathway **or** 1 College Transfer Pathway
2 CTE Pathways
1 CTE Pathway **and** 1 College Transfer Pathway

*****You may only choose 1 of these variations*****



Career and Technical Education (CTE) Pathway

The CTE Pathway leads to a career/technical education certificate or diploma aligned with a high school career cluster (as well as an associate in applied science degree).

Many of these courses align with CTE courses taught in public high schools.

Speak with your high school's Career and Development Coordinator (CDC) to discuss CCP options available before applying in addition to information regarding articulated credit (if applicable).

By taking the above high school course offerings with a minimum of a 'B' grade or passing the associated MOS exams, students can receive:

- substitution credit (maximum 9 credits) toward the Office Software Certificate (C253705A), **and**
- substitution credit (maximum 18 credits) toward the Medical Office Professional, Legal Office, Office Finance, Office Professional, and Office Software AAS degrees.

Career and Technical Education (CTE) Pathway Eligibility

Freshman and Sophomore (9th & 10th)

For participation in the pathways below only:

Engineering Technologies (40xxx)

Construction Technologies (35xxx)

Business Technologies (25xxx)

Information Technologies (25xxx)

- Recommendation of the high school principal/designee **and** his/her rationale for recommendation (in memo form) *Transcript still needed even without a GPA; **and**
- Passed Math 1 with a grade of C or better, an EOC score of 3, 4, or 5 for Math 1, and an EOG score of 3, 4, or 5 on the 8th grade ELA Assessment; **or**
- Demonstrate college readiness in English, Reading, and Math on an approved assessment (PSAT 10, PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, Pre-ACT, ACT, or Wake Tech RISE)

College Transfer (CT) Pathway Eligibility

Freshman and Sophomore (9th & 10th)

- Be identified as gifted by:
 - Local AIG plan in all areas (English/Reading and Math); **or**
 - Aptitude **and** achievement test scores in the range of the 92nd and 99th percentiles from recommended Buros Center Tests; **and**
- Demonstrate college readiness in English, Reading and Math on an approved assessment (PSAT 10, PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, Pre-ACT, ACT, or Wake Tech RISE); **and**
- Recommendation of the high school principal (or equivalent administrator), via memo, verifying maturity to enroll; **and**
- Written consent of the student's parent/guardian; **and**
- Participate in Mandatory Academic Advising

Things You Should Know Before Applying!

- **Students are only allowed up to four years of academic coursework**
One year as a Freshman, Sophomore, Junior and Senior only
- **CCP courses are actual college courses**
Students must earn a “C” or better in courses to transfer college credit earned
Courses completed may appear on the student’s high school and college transcripts
NOTE: Consult with high school representative to discuss transcript/graduation specifics
- **CCP Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy**
Students are required to maintain 2.0 GPA after the completion of two (2) college courses to remain eligible. Failure to meet policy will result in Academic Concern. Discontinuation of enrollment becomes effective if cumulative GPA is below 2.0 during subsequent term resulting in removal from the program
- **FERPA (Family Education Rights and Privacy Act)**
All rights to inspect and review the education record transfers from the parent to the student under FERPA when a student enters Wake Tech on the first day of class



Things You Should Know Before Applying!

- Students are required to follow all Wake Tech student policies and procedures
- Students are highly encouraged to meet with high school representatives to discuss their intent to enroll. Discussion points may include...
 - Pathway Selection(s)
 - Course Planning
 - High School Schedule Restrictions
 - Other relatable topics
- Spring 2026 Application is now available and is due by November 14. All dates and deadlines are posted on the CCP website.
- Registration and Records Office will post the spring course schedule on October 21st so this is when students can begin to explore available courses within their pathways.
