# Dual Enrollment (CCP)




Wake Tech Community College offers free courses through their Dual Enrollment (CCP) program. Eligible students can choose between two pathways:

### Promotion

9th to 10th English I; 2 credits in the areas of math, social studies, or science; and 3 additional credits

High school students shall be promoted by attaining credits that are earned through successful completion of specific courses as illustrated in the above chart. Note that the appropriate English credit is required for promotion each year.

## GPA

A student's grade point average (GPA) is calculated by adding all quality points earned while in high school (grades 9-12) and dividing by the number of courses taken. The weighted GPA includes any additional quality points earned by taking Honors/AP/IB courses, while the unweighted GPA does not include any additional quality points. Courses that are assigned Ps, PC-19 and credits earned via Credit by Demonstrated Mastery (CDM) do not count towards the overall GPA.




