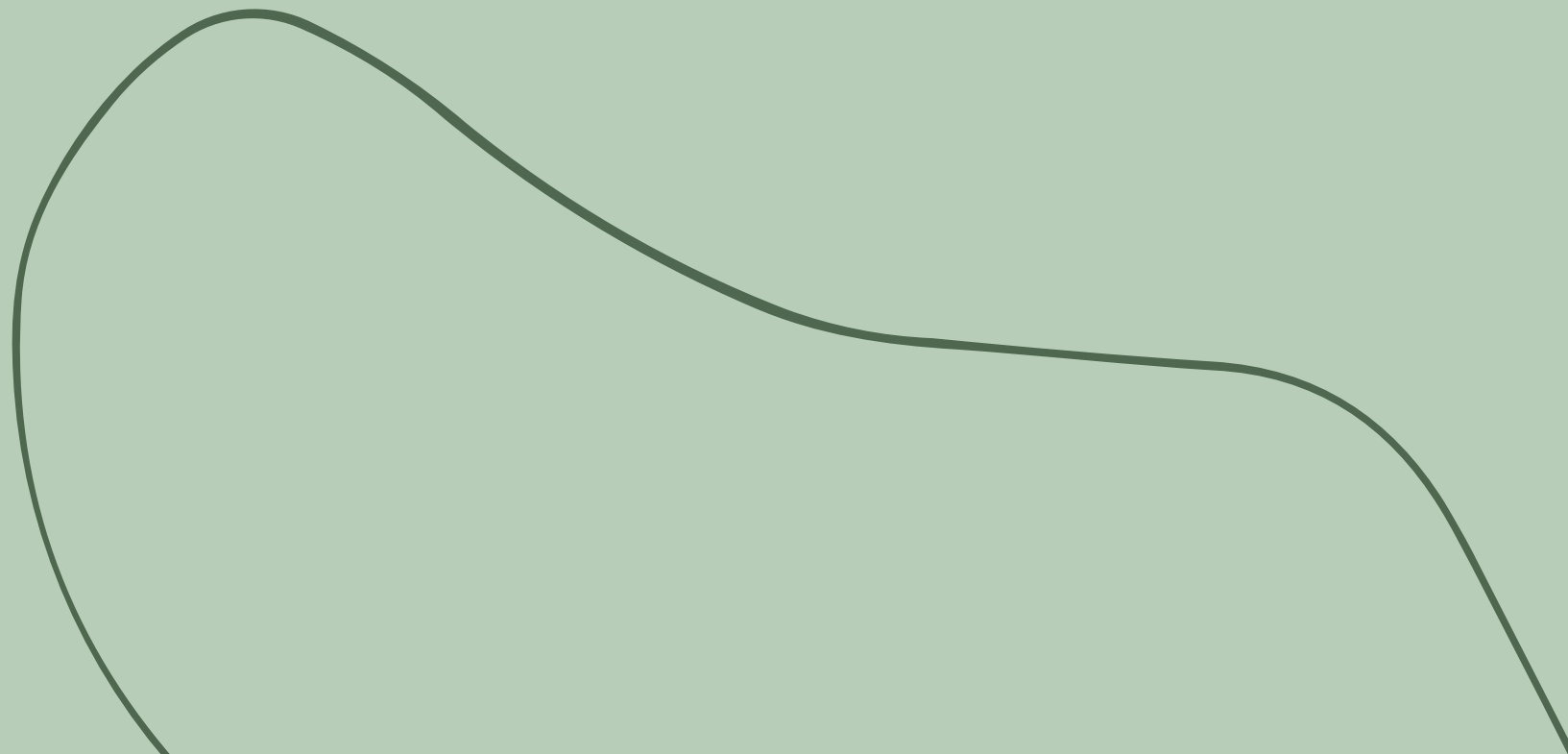

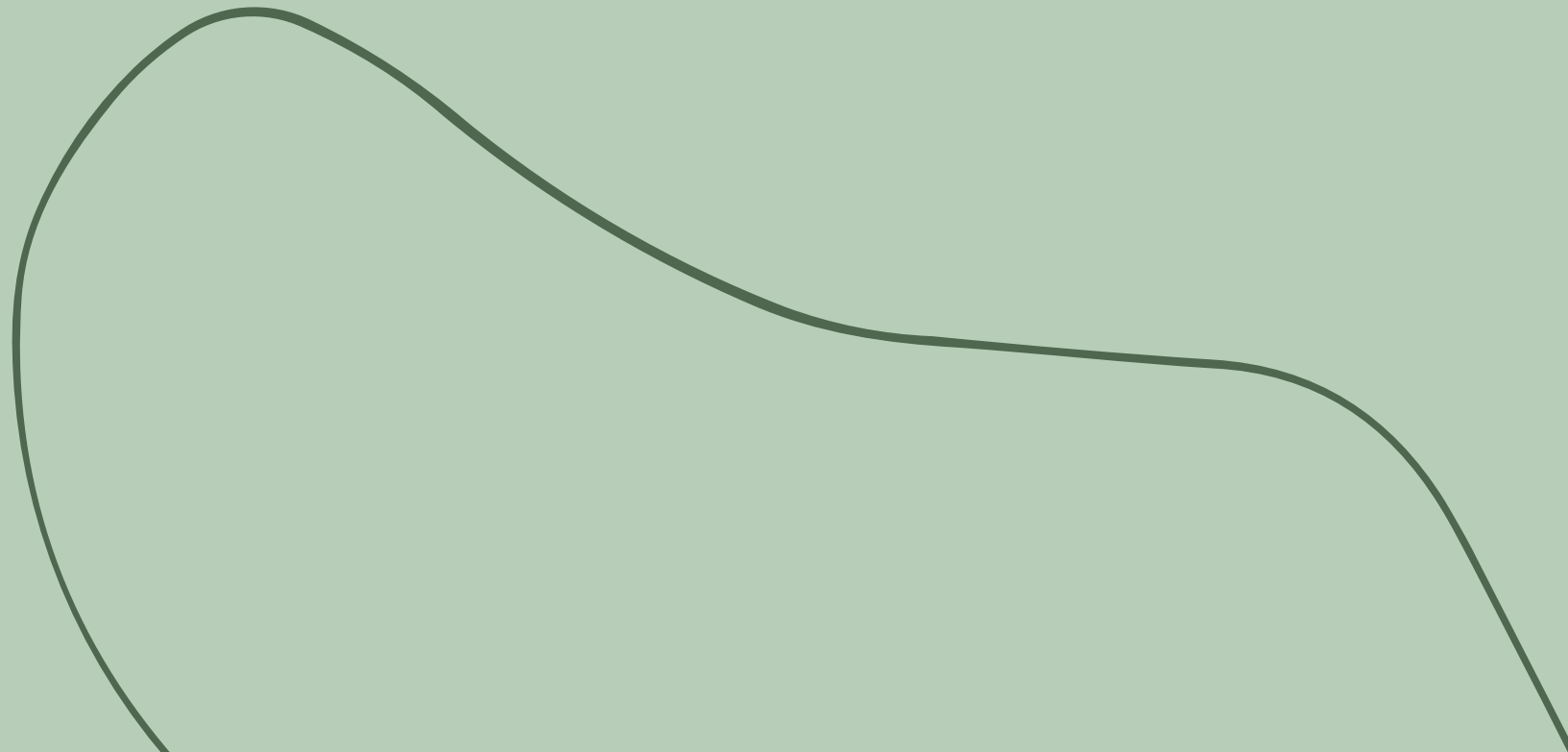

Four-Year College & University

- **How to apply:**
 - Common Application (Common App)
 - CFNC – College Foundation of NC
 - For NC colleges only
 - Residency Determination
 - Coalition for Access, Affordability, and Success (CAAS)
 - College Websites
 - For out-of-state colleges not on Common App or CAAS

CFNC: NC College Connect

- Weighted GPA of 2.8+
- Receive automatic enrollment to select NC colleges and universities
- Eligible students will see their list of tailored colleges they have received admissions to in their CFNC portal
 - Create an account
- Submit the form to claim your spot

Student Responsibilities

- Research admission requirements
- Request teacher recommendations – notify teachers
- Request counselor reports
 - Includes filling out google form and attaching resume (at least 3 weeks prior to deadline)
 - Google form links in Senior Canvas website
- Request test scores from College Board (SAT) and ACT
- Request transcripts at the beginning of October
- Complete applications, including writing essays

Transcript Availability

- Transcripts are finalized toward the end of September/beginning of October.
- This includes updated class rank and approved dual enrollment summer courses and grades (ex. CCP).
- We will notify seniors when transcripts are finalized through the Senior Canvas Website. All seniors will receive a paper copy of their updated transcript once they are finalized.

NCAA Athletes

- NCAA evaluates the applicant's academic record to determine eligibility to compete as a student athlete at a Division I or II college/university
- Review eligibility requirements and register at www.eligibilitycenter.org

****The college/university must accept applicant through admissions****

Standardized Tests



Many schools are test-optional.
Please check with college admissions office/websites for more
details and guidance.
Official scores should be requested from respective websites.

UNC System Schools update – Students with a weighted High School GPA greater than or equal to 2.50 and less than 2.80 are required to submit a standardized test score of a 17 or higher on the ACT or a 930 or higher on the SAT.

AP Exams



- Taken in May
- Fee is waived for exam if you are taking the corresponding course in that school year
- Check college websites for AP exam credit/placement
- Generally used for course placement once admitted

- Remember to keep track of scholarships received
- Student Services will request scholarship information using a form that will be available all year on the Senior Canvas website.
- Seniors will need to submit documentation (e.g., letter from college or scholarship program) for each scholarship reported
