ACT-SO (Afro-Academic, Cultural, Technological, and Scientific Olympics)** is a prestigious NAACP program that inspires, supports, and recognizes high academic and cultural achievements among African American students. The 2025 local ACT-SO Competition will take place in April in Raleigh, and gold medalists will advance to the National ACT-SO Competition in July, hosted in Charlotte, NC. National medalists have historically earned scholarships, iPads, AirPods, and more! ACT-SO features 31 categories spanning STEM, humanities, business, performing arts, and visual arts. Since its inception, nearly 300,000 students have participated nationwide. For over three decades, ACT-SO has been dedicated to preparing, recognizing, and rewarding youth of African descent who demonstrate exceptional scholastic and artistic talent.
