### Seniors interested in seeking a degree in education [STEM, Middle Grades, Elementary Education or Special Education]:

For students interested in learning more about the NC State College of Education, the virtual information session offered on Wednesdays throughout the fall semester I recommended. In addition, the Open House at NC State on Saturday, October 19, is recommended.

For students interested in learning more about the Teaching Fellows Program, attending a virtual Teaching Fellows Information session on September 24, October 16, or December 12 from 7:00-8:00pm is recommended.

### Seniors interested in East Carolina University:

**East Carolina University [ECU]** has a number of scholarships available for incoming freshmen – some specific to geographical locations and certain high schools, some need based and some merit based and some a combination of any of these factors. ECU utilizes an on-line portal, **ECUAWard**, to accept applications for their scholarship opportunities. To complete the scholarship application, a student must have been accepted for admission, but they do not have to commit to attending ECU to apply for scholarship consideration. The scholarship application portal is open August 1-January 15 for applications for funding for the 2025-2026 academic year. Students interested in the Honors College, the scholarship deadline is December 3<sup>rd</sup> so need to apply for Admission early in the cycle. ### Seniors interested in the University of Virginia:

**The Jefferson Scholars Foundation is now accepting nominations for the Jefferson Scholarship.** Jefferson Scholarships are awarded to high school seniors who demonstrate excellence and exceptional potential in the areas of leadership, scholarship, and engaged citizenship. Recipients receive the entire cost of attendance at UVA and many supplemental enrichment experiences – a value of more than \$345,000. Broughton may nominate one student, and the deadline for submitting all required materials is November 15, 2024. If interested in being considered for nomination, see Dean Sauls before October 15, 2024.

### Students interested in Davidson College:

**Broughton has been invited to submit up to two outstanding seniors for their John M. Belk Scholarship.** The scholarship covers funding [tuition, fees, food, and housing for four years, plus \$6,000 in special opportunity stipends. It recognized powerful students with demonstrated academic excellence, integrity, intellectual curiosity, willingness to take risks, and potential to be change agents in both their local and global communities. Nominations are due on November 1, 2024. If interested in being considered for nomination, see Dean Sauls before October 1, 2024.

Summer Study in Oxford and Cambridge & New York: Programs offer students in grades 8-to 12 the chance to spend a week, two weeks , or four weeks challenging themselves intellectually in traditional disciplines, such as Economics, History, Literature, Politics, or Speech and Debate, as well as in subjects that are less commonly offered to school-age students, such as Aerospace Engineering, Architecture, Business, Engineering, Law, or Musical Theater, to mention but a few of the 150+ options on offer.
