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Schedule Corrections

Lunch

How will it work?



Students should allocate about 26 minutes for eating and the other 26 minutes for their activity. Some logistics that will help you during Lunch include:

- The lunch is divided into two periods of time: A Lunch which is 10:25-10:52am and B Lunch which is 10:52-11:18am. Students will hear a bell ring at the beginning of B Lunch. Clubs and tutorials will often be advertised as happening during either A or B Lunch.
- Students are allowed to be in the cafeteria, with teachers attending tutorials or clubs, in the courtyard (weather permitting), or in another approved/supervised setting. The Media Center is also available to students for silent reading, group work, or time on the computer.
- Staff members monitor “open” areas during lunch.
- AllTimely is the program used for assigning/signing up for lunch activities.

How do Tutorials Work?

1. Students can choose to attend a tutorial, a club meeting, or socialize.
2. Students may be assigned a tutorial by their teacher.
 - a. If a student forgets to attend a assigned tutorial they will be assigned a second time. If they do not attend the second time, they will meet with their administrator, parent contact will be made, and they will be assigned one day of lunch detention and they will attend the originally assigned tutorial.
3. We will use AllTimely as our lunch system, it will work on their Chromebooks.

Students will be allowed to use their devices at lunch.



Grade Recovery



The grade recovery for minor assessments(quizzes)is built into the major assessments(tests). Grade replacement will be used.

For major assessments, a student has to earn the right to recover points. Whatever is assigned will take approximately 30-45 minutes. When the assignment is completed the student will be allowed to recover points.

Cell Phone Policy



NC State Legislation

General Restriction:

The core of the policy is a ban on cellphone use during class time.

Exceptions:

There are specific exceptions, including:

- *Educational use authorized by a teacher.*
- *Emergency situations.*
- *When required by a student's individualized education program (IEP) or Section 504 plan.*
- *For managing a student's health care needs.*



Cell Phone Policy



The expectation at FGHS is that the students keep their cell phones on silent and in their book bags from bell to bell of each class unless instructed to use by the teacher.
