OUR SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Cary is a residential suburb near Raleigh, North Carolina and located in the Research Triangle Park. Cary's main industries are Information Technology, Life Sciences, Clean Technology, and Advanced Manufacturing. There are six non-profit universities and a community college in the area. Cary High School is listed as the first public high school in North Carolina. Students at Cary are proud of the long history of the school and the many traditions that accompany this history, as well as its diverse student body. In addition to the normal curriculum, students have the option to participate in AP Capstone, our most rigorous academic program, an Academy of Technology and Advanced Manufacturing, and Career and College Promise Dual Enrollment courses at Wake Technical Community College.

CURRICULUM

English: Four years of English (junior and senior years have an AP option) Math: Three years of standard math, then any fourth math course

Science: Biology, Earth/Environmental Science (AP option), and a physical science course (chemistry, physical science, or physics)

Social Studies: For the Class of 2023, four courses are required: World History, Civics & Economics, and American History I and II (or AP US History or an American History and any fourth social studies elective) Healthful Living: Healthful Living or ROTC I & II

Advanced Placement Level (designated on transcript): Research, Seminar, English Language, English Literature, Statistics, Calculus AB/BC, US Government and Politics, US History, World History, Macroeconomics, Environmental Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1: Algebra-Based, Psychology, Music Theory, Studio Art: Drawing, Human Geography, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, French Language, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles. Students have the option to complete the AP Capstone Diploma.

<u>Career-Related Courses</u>: NJROTC, Culinary Arts, Construction, Business, Early Childhood Education, Marketing, Drafting, Digital Media, Technology, Project Lead the Way (PLTW), CCP/Dual Enrollment and Vocational/ Independent Living Skills. An Academy of Advanced Manufacturing and Technology is available starting in the 22-23 school year. Job experiences are offered through cooperative education and internships.

Performing & Visual Arts: Visual Arts, Vocal Music, Theatre, Marching Band, Concert Band, Jazz Ensemble, Strings Ensemble and Orchestra.
