Gates Millennium Scholars Program

Applications for the 2016 GMS opened August 1, 2015. To be eligible for the Gates Millennium Scholars Program students must:

- Be African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian American/Pacific Islander or Hispanic American;
- Be Citizens, legal permanent residents or nationals of the United States;
- Have cumulative GPA of 3.3 on an un-weighted 4.0 scale or earned a GED;
- Have demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in community service, extracurricular or other activities;
- Meet Federal Pell Grant eligibility criteria;
- Enroll for the first time at a US located, accredited college or university (with the exception of students concurrently pursuing a high school diploma) in the fall as a full-time degree seeking, first year student.

Deadline is January 13, 2016.

The GMSP provides support for the cost of education by covering unmet need and self-help aid; renewable awards for scholars maintaining satisfactory academic progress; Graduate school funding for continuing GMS in the areas of computer science, education, engineering, library science, mathematics, public health or science; leadership development programs with distinctive personal, academic and professional growth opportunities.

Jazmine Langley, a 2015 graduate from Wake Forest High School, was awarded this scholarship and would like to help students from our school successfully navigate the application process. To self-nominate go on line to Moorehead-Caine.org. You must be a competitive applicant to the University of North Carolina.
Levine Scholars Program UNC Charlotte	10/15/15	Fully Funded	Students must attend UNC Charlotte and be nominated by their school counselor by October 15th. This scholarship provides full tuition, room and board for eight semesters of undergraduate study at UNC Charlotte. Scholars will also have access to funding for four summer experiences and a service grant. The value of the schol- arship over four years is \$105,000 for North Carolina residents. See your counselor as soon as possible if you are interested in being nominated.

Applicants must enroll full time, and be high-achieving, well-rounded students. 36 awarded annually. The Robertson Scholars Program provides full tuition, room and board, and mandatory fees for each scholar for all four years of undergraduate study if the student maintains eligibility criteria. Scholars receive a laptop and have access to three summers of gener- ous funding, as well as support for up to two semesters of study abroad.
