ACT/SAT INFORMATION AND TEST DATES:

Students may take one or both for college admission entrance. Registration may be completed online at collegeboard.org and actstudent.org. SATII Subject Tests (formally Achievement tests): Some colleges require subject tests for placement. Contact the college's Office of Admissions for details. Keep all registration information in a safe place so you are able to refer back to your scores and send them to colleges of your choice.

TEST SCORES

In most cases, universities/colleges require the SAT and ACT scores to be reported directly to them from Education Testing Services (ETS) or ACT. There are two ways to have your scores reported to colleges:

- When you register to take the test, designate which universities/colleges are to receive your scores. All scores will be reported.
- 2. If you have already taken the test and now want the scores sent to a university/college you had not previously designated, you can do so by sending ETS an "Additional Report Request Form." This form comes with your SAT

NCAA: Students who plan to enroll as college freshman during the school year and participate in sports should complete the NCAA Eligibility Clearinghouse Form online at: **www.eligibilitycenter.org.** If you are unsure that you have registered and plan to play a college sport, you should see your counselor as soon as possible.

As the year begins student services will receive requests from colleges to review athletes transcripts. This is an important step in the recruitment process. In order to send them your transcripts we must have permission from your parents. Permission slips are available in student services for your parents to sign. These forms allow us to fax out your transcripts to coaches immediately when they request them. Don't miss out.

Pre-College Check list for September

- ⇒ Review your career goals and decide which type of school is right for you.
- ⇒ Attend college fairs and financial aid nights.
- ⇒ If necessary, check into SAT/ACT testing. Retest if necessary
- ⇒ Apply for scholarships and funding.
- ⇒ Visit some college campuses, narrow your choices.
- ⇒ Start asking for letters of recommendation
- ⇒ Nearly all scholarships/colleges require an essay. Begin writing one now. Let an English teacher help you!
- ⇒ PARENTS: Save your year-end payroll stub if it shows earnings for the year. You may need this for financial aid

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

For <u>any</u> and <u>all</u> scholarships you are awarded, whether you accept them or not, please bring your award letter to Student Services.

THE FOLLOWING TWO SCHOLARSHIPS ARE FULL RIDE TO NC STATE:

PARK SCHOLARSHIPS: The Park Scholarships application is online and is part of the NC State Undergraduate Admissions application. The Park Scholarship is a four year scholarship valued at \$98,000 for in state students and \$166,000 for out of State. Over 40 scholarships are awarded each year. To apply, apply for undergraduate admissions to NC State using the **wolfPAW** system by October 15th.

GOODNIGHT SCHOLARSHIP: To be eligible you must complete a general NC State application using the

wolfPAW system by Oct. 15th. Select a STEM major or STEM Education major. Students who are invited to apply typically rank in the top 2% of their class, Score above 1400 on the SAT and/or scores above a 32 on ACT and have at least a 3.9 (unweighted) GPA and or 4.8 (weighted). If you do not receive an invitation to apply from NC State and want to self nominate submit your nomination form by December 10th. Forms are available at emas.ncsu.edu/goodnight/how-to-apply/.

FULL RIDE TO UNC CHAPEL HILL:

MOREHEAD-CAIN SCHOLARSHIP: Apply to UNC (http://admissions.unc.edu/apply by the Early Action Deadline of October 15th to be considered for the Morehead-Cain. Be nominated by the UNC Admissions Office through the Admissions Referral Program. You may also be nominated by your high school or self nominate. For more information and to apply go to www.moreheadcain.org.

FULL RIDE TO UNC CHAPEL HILL AND OR DUKE UNIVERSITY:

ROBERTSON SCHOLARS: Students must apply to Duke or Chapel Hill by the respective Early or regular deadlines. Duke's early decision deadline is November 1, 2015 and regular deadline is January 1, 2016. UNC-Chapel Hill's early action deadline is October 15, 2015 and regular decision deadline is January. Students may self nominate by completing the Robertson online application. Robertsonscholars.org/apply/

<u>VFW Voice of Democracy:</u> A premier scholarship program that is an audio-essay contest for high school students that provides millions in scholarships and incentives. Students compete by writing and recording an audio essay on this years patriotic theme of "My Vision for America". Deadline for submission to the Wake Forest Memorial Post is midnight Nov. 1st. Pick up a brochure with application information in Student Services.
